

Using the Sea Striker Ribbonfish Rig

The Sea Striker Ribbonfish Rig was designed with the help of local fishing experts. The use of coffee-colored wire in the front allows the wire to blend into the water surrounding it. The silver wire and hooks closely match the silver sides of the ribbonfish.

The Ribbonfish Rig comes in two styles: with and without a butterbean bucktail. The butterbean bucktail serves to both balance the ribbonfish, and give it the natural nose-down swimming action. Any jig head will balance the bait, but the flat sides of the butterbean bucktail also deflect the water as the boat rocks, giving the bait some side-to-side swimming motion.

Rigging a ribbonfish is very easy with the Sea Striker Ribbonfish Rig. First, run the jig hook up through the bottom of the ribbonfish's mouth and out through the top. This secures the ribbonfish to the rig and pins its mouth closed so it won't fill up with water and deteriorate. Then, lay the trailing hooks down one side of the ribbonfish and place one barb of each hook into the side of the bait. Be sure that there is a small amount of slack between the hooks to allow the ribbonfish to "swim". The bait is now ready to use.
